In it Smith described the principles of “ human nature, ” which, together with Hume and the other leading philosophers of his time, he took as a universal and unchanging datum from which social institutions, as well as social behaviour, could be deduced. The Impartial Spectator: Adam Smith's Moral Philosophy ...

Adam Smith argues that virtue falls into two broad categories: “ justice, ” which he calls a “ negative ” virtue because it principally comprises restraint from harming or injuring others; and “ beneficence, ” which he calls “ positive ” because it comprises the actions we ought to take to improve others ’ situations.

Smith was Professor of Moral Philosophy at the University of Glasgow and a key figure in the Scottish Enlightenment. His *Theory of Moral Sentiments* (1759) was well-regarded at the time but faded from the philosophical canon in the 19th century and has only recently been subject to a revival of interest among philosophers.
