The Rifle Company was the main maneuver unit of the Armored Infantry Battalion and the typical mechanized infantry company in the U.S. Army during World War II, equivalent to the German Panzergrenadiers (although most Panzergrenadier units were mounted in trucks rather than half-tracks). The company was made up of the Company Headquarters, 1 Antitank Platoon, 3 Rifle Platoons and an attached medical vehicle.

Mechanized infantry are infantry units equipped with armored personnel carriers or infantry fighting vehicles for transport and combat. Mechanized infantry is distinguished from motorized infantry in that its vehicles provide a degree of protection from hostile fire, as opposed to "soft-skinned" wheeled vehicles for motorized infantry. This is an overview of the organization and equipment of the U.S. Army's Armored Infantry Rifle Company from 1943 to 1945. These were essentially mechanized infantry mounted mostly in M3A1 Half-Tracks. They were intended to work in concert with Tank Companies (which were a 3-to-1 ratio of Shermans and Stuarts).

A full Stryker brigade was intended to be C-130 Hercules air transportable into theatre within 96 hours, while a division-sized force is expected to need 120 hours. The Stryker brigade is an organic combined arms unit of lightly-armored ...

Some units have two squads that made up a section, commanded by a staff sergeant. Normally, a platoon includes 16 to 44 soldiers and is led by a lieutenant with an NCO as second in command. A platoon usually consists of three to four squads or sections. A company contains three to five platoons and a total of 60 to 200 soldiers.

~~How the U.S. Army Is Organized~~

The Headquarters company of the armored infantry battalion had an assault gun platoon with three M8 howitzer motor carriages, but change 5 to the T/O&E (9 September 1944) replaced them with M4 medium tanks armed with 105 mm howitzers; the actual replacement, however, took place gradually between December 1944 and April 1945, and some units did not get them at all.
