Conscious Sedation is a vital part of modern dentistry enabling a huge number of patients with anxieties and phobias to access care they otherwise could not tolerate. In the UK this involves the administration of sedative drugs which patients may take orally, Page 19/42

inhale or have injected. As well as removing anxiety these drugs can have many significant side effects which the dental team must be able to recognise and manage in a calm and effective way.

The Intercollegiate Advisory Committee for Sedation in Dentistry (IACSD) guidelines came out in April Page 31/42

2015 with the aim of creating a UKwide guideline document for conscious sedation in dentistry; this was soon implemented by NHS England and underwent a review process by the Chief Dental officers and assigned bodies in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. (It could not be Page 32/42

implemented simultaneously in all countries of the UK as a result of the devolved nature of the health service)
