Psychiatric Emergencies in Bipolar and Related Disorders ...

Hypokinetic emergencies include neuroleptic malignant syndrome, parkinsonism-hyperpyrexia syndrome, acute parkinsonism, and psychosis in Parkinson disease. Hyperkinetic emergencies include hemiballismus-hemichorea, autoimmune orobuccolingual dyskinesia, serotonin syndrome, posthypoxic and other types of myoclonus, and acute dystonia.

Movement disorder emergencies are associated with significant morbidity and mortality, emphasising the need for their prompt identification and emergency management.

Almost all people affected by emergencies will experience psychological distress, which for most people will improve over time. Among people who have experienced war or other conflict in the previous 10 years, one in 11 (9%) will have a moderate or severe mental disorder. One person in five (22%) living in an area affected by conflict is estimated to have depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder, bipolar disorder or schizophrenia.

Such situations meet the working definition of an [lemergency, a rapidly evolving disorder (hours to days) in which the failure to diagnose and treat may lead to significant morbidity or mortality. 1 This review is divided into 2 parts based on phenomenology, hypokinetic and hyperkinetic disorders, and it discusses rapidly evolving situations that require emergency intervention. A number of the disorders discussed are rare.
