In general, PCORI PFAs fund projects for three years, with budgets of less than \$500,000 (of Direct Costs) during any year of the project period. However, PCORI is willing to consider projects that exceed either the three-year project limit or the \$500,000 (of Direct Costs) budget cap, provided special permission is granted

What are PCORI's guidelines for treatment cost/coverage? The delivery system, payer, manufacturer, or developer of the intervention must cover costs for study interventions. Given the reimbursement barriers often associated with nonpharmacological alternatives to opioids, the applications must specifically address, in the context of the proposed studies, the support from payers, health plans, industry sponsors or others in covering the study interventions.

An applicant may resubmit an application that was not funded but that did complete PCORI's merit review process (i.e., the applicant received a summary statement). For research awards, PCORI does not limit the number of times an applicant may resubmit.

PCORI monitors the performance of funded projects to ensure awardees adhere to deliverables, milestones, and other requirements described in their contracts. PCORI has a limit on the amount of salary a person can collect under a contract. If an individual's salary is \$250,000, can the applicant charge \$200,000 to the contract at 80 percent of the individual's time? Is the personal salary cap per individual or per application? Is it annual or total?

PCORI seeks to support projects that incorporate active strategies designed to move comparative clinical effectiveness research (CER) evidence developed with PCORI research funding toward practical use in improving health care and health outcomes.

The PCORI fee is calculated on the average number of lives covered under a specified health insurance policy. Generally, issuers of specified health insurance policies must use one of the following four alternative methods to determine the average number of lives covered under a policy for the policy year. The Affordable Care Act (ACA) imposes a fee on health insurance issuers and plan sponsors of self-insured health plans to help fund the PatientCentered Outcomes Research Institute. The fee, called the Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) fee, is calculated based on the average number of lives covered under the policy or plan.

In the future, the IRS intends to publish the adjusted PCORI fee amount for plan years ending on or after Oct. 1, 2015, and before Oct. 1, 2019. The PCORI fees are based on the average number of covered lives under the plan or policy. This generally includes employees and their enrolled spouses and dependents.
