Rural America traditionally has had higher rates of poverty for decades. According to a Social Science Research Council study, 24% of children living in rural areas live in poverty, compared to 20% of children in urban areas. More than 20% of youth living in rural areas are "disconnected," meaning they are neither employed nor attending school.

Bridging the Rural-Urban Divide: Why Youth Intervention ...

For young people (15-29 years) specifically, the percentage of those at risk of poverty or social exclusion is 29.8%, an increase of 3.9% from 2014. The share of young people (aged 18 to 24) living in rural areas who were neither in employment nor in further education or training (NEET) was 3.7% higher than in cities.
