Paris says that Juliet ' s grief about Tybalt ' s death has made her unbalanced, and that Capulet, in his wisdom, has determined they should marry soon so that Juliet can stop crying and put an end to her period of mourning. The friar remarks to himself that he wishes he were unaware of the reason that Paris ' s marriage to Juliet should be delayed.
